In a world where so much of the news can seem tragic, disheartening, or just downright "bad," I get at least one respite a week. I subscribe to the CNN newsletter entitled, "The Good Stuff." It comes on Saturday morning. Often, I don't check my phone/email as regularly on the weekends as I do during the week. I sometimes miss this newsletter, but I have become committed to reading it each week whenever I can. It provides a healthy perspective on good things happening in our world. Whenever I read it, I actively feel a sense of calm and peace come over me.

While many of the stories and videos in the newsletter are captivating in their own right, the opening paragraph almost always has some really great thoughts. If you subscribe to this email (and I do recommend it), don't ever skip that first paragraph. It is never a throwaway filler. I have found some deeply theological sentiments expressed in this part of the newsletter.

On Saturday, September 16, the opening paragraph had these lines:

"Did you know that the vibrant hues leaves turn in the fall are their actual colors? It's true — leaves that change color are naturally those orange, red and yellow shades, but during half of the year, those hues are overwhelmed by green chlorophyll. Colder, cloudier months mean less chlorophyll, which means the trees and flora can finally show their true colors. It's kind of poetic, isn't it? A lot of people see the changing colors of the season as a prelude to the barrenness of winter, but really it's a special show all its own — one full of unexpected, unique life."

Do you see how deeply theological that is? We can easily get overwhelmed by the bad

news. We can let other, exterior things "color" us and our vibrant hues can hide.

Upon entering worship each Sunday, the hugs and handshakes begin to strip those overwhelming forces that hide our true colors. Hearing the gospel proclaimed, joining our voices in corporate hymn singing and prayer, clasping hands at the end of the service allow our true colors to return.

We know the call in Christ to work for justice, to be a voice for the voiceless, "to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God." That's our true "colors!" When we are connected to God and to each other, we can hold the overwhelming forces at bay and let our true colors shine.

In this stewardship month, we are celebrating that because of you (us), our church makes a difference. We can be most effective in making that difference when we let our true colors shine and we work for justice so that all God's creatures can let their true colors shine too!

I'm thankful for each of you and your true colors. They are a blessing to me and a gift to this world!





September, 2023 operating income of \$23,236 was \$12,960 **below** the monthly income budget. Operating expenses for the month were \$30,357 resulting in a **deficit** of (\$7,120) in September, and a YTD **deficit** of (\$20,532). Faith offerings have hit their monthly low this past month, however, the cost of our ministries at work in the world continues. We look forward in prayer to a theology of generosity and the ability to strengthen the growth of our ministries as we move forward in 2023. 
Wendy, CE, youth parents, and Rev. Doty have met and mapped out youth activities for the year. While we have secured adult organizers for some of these events, we still need volunteers to ensure the vitality of the program year. Please see Wendy or Rev. Dan if you can volunteer some time to make an impact in the lives of our youth.



During the 11th AACC General Assembly held in Kigali, Rwanda, in 2018, on the theme, "Respecting the Dignity and God's Image in Every Human Being," delegates expressed their deep concern about the plight of widows in Africa. They called on the AACC General Secretariat to address the issue with urgency. Global Ministries was the first to respond with an offer to begin the process. In 2019, AACC established *Justice for Widows Campaign*. Because of harmful cultural norms and beliefs, widows in some African communities are subjected to dehumanizing practices, which rob them of their rights and dignity and expose them to poverty. These include denial of inheritance and land rights, eviction from the late husband's homes, humiliating cultural rites, and stigma.

The plight of widows is a global concern that has drawn the attention of the United Nations (UN). In 2010, the UN set apart June 23 as International Widows' Day to create awareness of the violation of human rights that widows suffer in many countries. The day also highlights the need for more research and statistics into violence, discrimination, and poverty suffered by widows.

Through the Justice for Widows Campaign, AACC has developed an Advocacy Tool Kit for Justice for Widows that offers practical advocacy skills for the rights of widows. As part of mission stewardship, AACC seeks to continue collaborating with Global Ministries in the capacity-strengthening process for heads of women/gender programs and widows to use the tool kit.
