

The new year is full of time. As the seconds tick away, will you be tossing time out the window or will you make every minute count?

Casual Christmas Carol Sing & Brunch


Join your church family on the First Sunday after Christmas (Dec. 31st this year) for a casual service of carol singing in our Fellowship Hall. Wear a Christmas

OUR CHURCH OFFICE WILL BE CLOSED DECEMBER 25-JANUARY 1

November, 2023 operating income of \$27,680 was \$8,525 **below** the monthly income budget. Operating expenses for the month were \$30,570 resulting in a deficit of (\$2,890) in November, and a YTD deficit of (\$28,040). Advent is the season of anticipation as we await the birth of Christ. We look forward in prayer to a theology of generosity and the ability to strengthen the growth of our ministries as we move forward into 2024. END OF YEAR FINANCIAL INFORMATION

BLUE CHRISTMAS A Service of Comfort for the Weary

Blue Christmas. During the holidays, so many of us can suffer for all kinds of reasons. The magnitude of our weary world weighs on our hearts and minds. We wrestle with chronic pain, broken relationships, shattered dreams, fragile faith, and unexpected losses. Our grief and sorrow feel particularly acute when compared to the festivity and joy everyone else seems to be feeling. In response to these realities, First Congregational Church of Tallmadge will offer a "Blue Christmas" service (also sometimes called the Longest Night service).


This contemplative service will allow for space to reflect on our grief and longing during this season. Soothing scriptures and subdued hymn singing will allow us to hear the Christmas story while not being forced to sing "Joy to the World" when our hearts are hurting. Our Blue Christmas service will be held on Thursday, Dec. 21st (the Longest Night) at 5:00 PM.

LUNCH BUNCH BOOK STUDY

Join the Lunch Bunch Book Study Group this winter for a study of the book "Chosen?" by biblical scholar (and ordained UCC pastor) Walter Brueggemann.

"The conflict is only 'seemingly' beyond solution, because all historicalpolitical problems have solutions, if there is enough courage, honesty, and steadfastness."

In Chosen?, Walter Brueggemann explores the situation in modern-



day Israel that raises questions for many Christians who are easily confused when reading biblical accounts of God's saving actions with the Israelites. Are modern Israeli citizens the descendants of the Israelites in the Bible whom God called chosen? Was the promise of land to Moses permanent and irrevocable? What about others living in the promised land? How should we read the Bible in light of the modern situation? Who are the Zionists, and what do they say?

In four chapters, Brueggemann addresses the main questions people have with regard to what the Bible has to say about this ongoing issue. 
We will meet in the David Bacon Room at noon on Wednesdays beginning January 10, 2024. Bring a lunch and bring a friend!

The transformative power of solidarity and partnership is changing lives in the heart of Morocco. Dorcas Ngo Nolga, a 45-year-old Cameroonian mother living in the city of Mohammedia, shares her heartfelt gratitude with the CEI community (the International Aid Committee) in nearby Casablanca.

Dorcas, once grappling with health issues and a tight financial reality, found herself on the path of healing and wholeness through the compassionate efforts of the CEI and support from our global partners, including the Disciples and UCC through Global Ministries.

In her poignant testimony, Dorcas recalls a moment of vulnerability when she was facing critically high blood pressure and a lack of financial means to get nec-

essary medical tests. Through fervent prayers and the collaborative efforts of the CEI, she not only received emergency medical attention but also underwent multiple consultations with specialists, resulting in a remarkable improvement in her health. Her high blood pressure is now under control and is no longer an urgent crisis. Dorcas emphasizes that beyond her physical healing, she discovered a family within the CEI that extended a helping hand when she needed it most, saving her life. Her gratitude overflows when she tells us of the blessing she encountered through this community that embodies the spirit of compassion and salvation.
