

"Be the Light"

On Sunday, January 21st, the Gospel lesson is from the first chapter of Mark verses 14-20. It begins by stating, "Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God." One blogger piqued my attention when he wrote, "watch the verbs – arrested, came, proclaiming."

With the verb *arrested,* we are alerted to something. We are alerted to the fact that those who stand and prophetically proclaim the justice, mercy and love of God are sometimes seen as threats to the status quo.



Now, to be sure, John had called out the ruling elite when he "invited" them to the baptism of the repentance of sin by saying, "You brood of vipers flee from the wrath to come" (in Luke's telling). It might have been harsh, but it was the voice of justice daring to speak a word in an unjust world.

The next verb *came* reiterates for us that Jesus was on a holy and urgent mission. He'd no doubt heard of the arrest of John and knew there would be consequences for the ministry he was going to undertake. Knowing that, he still came "proclaiming the good news of God." As the blogger Steve Garnass-Holmes states it,

"The word of God's disruptive grace, the fierce and tender love that undermines the Empire itself is good news for bad times.

Jesus had "good news for bad times"!

I, like some of you, have felt that these past several years have been filled with more "bad" news than "good" news. We struggled to be authentic Christians shining the light of Christ into a darkened world. We watched many of our Evangelical brothers and sisters who refused raise a prophetic counter-witness to the unjust practices that had unfolded. But in this season of Epiphany, we are called to be the light. We are called by the light of the world, to share "God's disruptive grace" and be "the fierce and tender love" in a world that seems to be filled with hate.

Last month, we also remembered the justice work of the Rev. Dr. King. I've been thinking of a

quote that I often like to use of his. King once said that, "the arc of the moral universe is long, but it bends toward justice. "I believe that with all of my heart, BUT I also believe that it does not bend by itself. We must be the "benders." We have the charge and responsibility as the followers of Christ to bend that arc and ensure that movement toward a just world for all. I can say it no better than the Inaugural poet Amanda Gorman when she ended her poignant and beautiful poem, "The Hill We Climb," by saying,

"When day comes, we step out of the shade aflame and unafraid.

The new dawn blooms as we free it.

For there is always light, if only we're brave enough to see it.

If only we're brave enough to be it."



MONTHLY FINANCIALS





December, 2023 operating income of \$54,591 was \$18,385 above the monthly income budget. Operating expenses for the month were \$32,964 resulting in a surplus of \$21,627 in December, and a YTD **deficit** of (\$6,414). We are thankful for the prayerful generosity of our congregation during Advent and Christmas, and we look forward in prayer to a theology of generosity and the ability to strengthen the growth of our ministries as we move forward into 2024. On Sunday, February 11, 2024, First Congregational church will host Abigail Reed, a Global Ministries Intern, at 9:00am in the Fellowship Hall. Abigail served as an intern in the Presbyterian Church in the Republic of Korea (PROK.) In her own



words, "Through the PROK, I primarily work at Yeonggang Shema Christian School; an alternative elementary and middle school that strives to provide students with a global vision through practicing love and consideration for others that resembles that of Jesus. Here, I teach speaking classes and oversee most of the English programming such as spelling bees, English musicals, and more. Secondarily, I support the English ministry programs at Yeonggang Church through assisting in English bible studies and teaching English classes at the daycare center."

Abigail will make a presentation in the Fellowship Hall at 9:00am. A light breakfast will be served. Make plans to come and hear about her experience as a ministry intern in Korea!

M.S., a Ukrainian refugee, is under international protection status in Greece due to the war. Perichoresis is their refuge and hope. The project, which provides accommodation and services to the family, is funded by the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and the United Church of Christ (UCC) through Global Ministries.

M.S. came to Greece with

her two children from the city of Polohy, in the Zaporizhzhia region, occupied by Russians. Since March 2022, their city has been on fire under active hostilities. It has been completely burned and destroyed, and now their house is occupied by the Russian military, and the quarter is destroyed. Today, they have nowhere to return. M.S. is 42 years old and has had three operations with the loss of the corresponding organs and chronic diseases, including those requiring constant medication.

Through the specific project, M.S. and her family have found a house to live in safely and protected, and they live a normal daily life. They have medical care, a social environment, activities to participate in, and hugs from all of us in Perichoresis.


